NOTE: As per Lilledahl, the matrix number is BT 192-2 - however, the matrix number is stamped in wax as shown above. The title on the Swedish issue is "Jazzflickan". The suggested personnel names are taken from the Borge J. C. Moller 1945 discography. After all, BJCM interviewed musicians back then and must have had a certain basis for his info details. Titles like "Blues" (matrix BT 236 II) and "De svaje hid, de svaje did" (matrix BT 240 II), both recorded November 29, both released on HMV X 1915, and both composed by Emil Reesen, are of no interest. Also other recordings under Warny's banner, in 1923, and 1924, are not relevant in this context.

NOTE: Some discographies state the matrix number for "Dark Blue Night" to be OT827-II – however, the matrix number is stamped in wax as shown above. Wiedemann states that a part-personnel for this recording is listed in the periodical "Jazz Avisen", March 15, 1934, page 4. What is actually shown is a photo of Warny's band listing the names of the musicians seen (with no reference to this studio session). Also, it is not verified when and where the photo is taken – no drummer is seen, and only a trombone instrument but no trombone player. The above 2 sides may rather more accurately be termed dance music including passages of rhythmic ensemble phrasings, extremely well executed and accompanied by an easy swinging rhythm section.

Axel Petersen usually also played vco, but apparently not at this occasion, since the guitar is audible throughout. Erik Fiehn composed both titles.
